Have You Been Forgiven?

God's love for His people is shown throughout the Bible. Though I read about it all the time, God's love still blows my mind. It's hard for me to comprehend such a perfect love like His. Jesus is willing and ready to forgive you and to cleanse you from all unrighteousness by His sacrificial atonement on Calvary's cross (1 John 1:9). Don't delay, call on Him today and He will forgive you and wash all of your sins away.
